Academic Regulations 2025 (AR25) for B. Tech (Regular-Full time)

(Effective for the students admitted into I year from the Academic Year 2025-26 onwards)

1. Award of B.Tech Degree:

A student will be declared eligible for the award of the B.Tech Degree/B.Tech Degree with Honors/Minor if he/she fulfills the following academic regulations:

Registered for 160 credits and he/she must secure total 160 credits.

In case of B.Tech Degree with Honors (Minors), student has to secure additional 20 (18) credits fulfilling all the requisites of a B.Tech program i.e., 160 credits. Registering for Honors/Minor is optional and Honors is to be completed simultaneously with B.Tech programme.

Students, who fail to complete their four-year course of study within 8 years or fail to acquire the 160 Credits for the award of the degree within 8 academic years from the year of their admission, shall forfeit their seat in B.Tech programme and their admission shall stand cancelled.

2. Courses of study:

3. Program related terms:

Credit: A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (Lecture/Tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.

Credit Definition:

1 Hr. Lecture (L) per week	1 credit
1 Hr. Tutorial (T) per week	1 credit
1 Hr. Practical (P) per week	0.5 credit
2 Hrs. Practical (Lab) per week	1 credit

Semester: A semester comprises 90 working days and an academic year is divided into two semesters.

Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): The CBCS provides a choice for students to select from the prescribed courses.

4. Course pattern:

The entire course of study is of four academic years and each year will have TWO Semesters (Total EIGHT Semesters).

A student is eligible to appear for the end examination in a subject, but when absent for it or failed in the end examinations he/she may appear for that subject's supplementary examinations, when offered.

5. Evaluation Methodology:

The performance of a student in each semester shall be evaluated subject wise with a maximum of 100 marks for theory and 100 marks for practical subject. Summer Internships shall be evaluated for 100 marks, Full Semester Internship & Project work in final semester shall be evaluated for 200 marks, and mandatory courses with no credits shall be evaluated for 100 marks.

A student has to secure not less than 35% of marks in the end examination (in fraction rounded to lower digit) and a minimum of 40% of marks in the sum total of the mid semester and end examination marks taken together for the Theory, Integrated, Labs, design, drawing subject, project etc. In case of a mandatory course, he/she should secure 40% of the total marks.

Continuous internal assessment:

For theory subjects, during the semester, there shall be two midterm examinations. Each midterm examination shall be evaluated for **25** marks of which **5** marks for objective paper (10X0.5=5 marks) (10 minutes duration), **20** marks for subjective paper (90 minutes duration). Each subjective paper is to be held for **30** marks, and will be scaled down to **20** marks.

Subjective paper contains three descriptive type questions with internal choice.

The objective paper shall be conducted along with subjective paper test.

Sum of marks obtained in objective paper and subjective paper is taken as MID term exam marks.

Final midterm examination marks (25 marks) shall be arrived by considering the marks secured by the student in both the mid examinations with 80% Weightage given to the better mid exam and 20% to the other.

The first midterm examination will be conducted usually after completion of 50% syllabus (i.e. first 2.5 Units), and the second midterm examination will be conducted usually at the end of instruction (i.e. remaining 2.5 Units).

Assignment marks awarded based on minimum of two assignments (5 marks for each assignment) or one case study (group-wise). It should be continuous assessment throughout the semester and the average marks shall be considered.

Continuous internal assessment (30 marks) is a sum of final midterm examination (25 marks) and Assignment (5 marks).

Semester end examination:

The question paper shall have descriptive type questions held for **70** marks, with the duration of **180** minutes. There shall be one question from each unit with internal choice. Each question carries **14** marks (5X14M=70 marks).

Continuous internal assessment:

Day-to-day work in the laboratory shall be evaluated for **15** marks by the concerned laboratory teacher based on the regularity/record/viva and **15** marks for the internal test.

Semester end examination:

The end examination shall be conducted by the teacher concerned and external examiner from outside the college.

Procedure **20** marks, experimental work **10** marks, Results **20** marks and Viva voce **20** marks (or)

Description 10 marks, Programming Code 20 marks, Output 20 marks and Viva voce 20 marks.

Integrated Course:

Integrated courses are exclusively designed to provide a unique learning experience of layered learning where students have a chance to practice while learning. These courses are designed by blending both theory and laboratory components one over the other.

For Integrated courses, the evaluation of Theory and Laboratory are carried out separately as mentioned above for a maximum of **100** marks. A student has to secure not less than **35%** of marks in the semester end examinations of both theory and lab taken together and a minimum of **40%** of marks in the sum total of the mid semester and end examination marks taken together for both the Theory and Laboratory.

Continuous internal assessment:

Day-to-day work shall be evaluated for **20** marks by the concerned teacher based on the submission of sheets prepared in the class and **10** marks for the MID term test.

During the semester, there shall be two midterm examinations. Each midterm examination shall be evaluated for **30** marks subjective paper (120 minutes duration).

Subjective paper contains three descriptive type questions with internal choice.

MID term marks (10 marks) shall be arrived by considering the marks secured by the student in both the mid examinations with 80% weightage given to the better mid exam and 20% to the other.

Semester end examination:

The question paper shall have descriptive type questions for **70** marks. There shall be one question from each unit with internal choice. Each question carries **14** marks (5X14M=70 marks).

Health and Wellness, Yoga and Sports/NSS/NCC/Scouts&Guides/Community Service:

Evaluated for a total of 100 marks.

A student can select 6 activities of his/her choice with a minimum of 01 activity per unit. Each activity shall be evaluated by the concerned teacher for 15 marks, totalling to 90 marks.

A student shall be evaluated by the concerned teacher for **10** marks by conducting viva voce on the subject.

Mandatory course:

Mandatory course is one among the compulsory courses and does not carry any Credits.

Mandatory courses are evaluated through continuous evaluation and there is no semester end examination. No marks or letter grade shall be printed in the transcripts for all mandatory non-credit courses, but only Completed (Y)/Not-completed (N) will be specified.

A minimum of 75% attendance is required to complete Induction program and there is no evaluation.

The Mandatory courses Constitution of India, Environmental Science and Technical Paper Writing & IPR shall be evaluated for **100** marks. For evaluation two Midterm examinations (each **30** marks and question paper pattern is similar to theory course) will be conducted along with theory midterm examinations and two assignments of 20 marks each (4X5M=**20** marks). A minimum of **40** marks is required to complete these courses out of 100 marks (30+30+20+20 marks).

Design Thinking and Sustainable Development:

The Design Thinking and Sustainable Development course is assessed with a total of 100 marks, comprising 30 marks for internal evaluation and 70 marks for the semester-end examination.

For the internal evaluation, carrying 30 marks, is conducted in the form of a presentation and a Viva-Voce. This evaluation is carried out by an internal examiner (appointed by Principal) in conjunction with the internal supervisor of the Design Thinking and Sustainable Development course.

The semester-end examination, carrying 70 marks, is conducted in the form of a presentation and a Viva-Voce. This evaluation is carried out by an external examiner in conjunction with the internal supervisor of the Design Thinking and Sustainable Development course.

6. Attendance Requirements:

A student shall be eligible to appear for the semester-end examinations, if he/she acquires a minimum of 75% of attendance in aggregate of all the subjects.

Condonation of shortage of attendance in aggregate up to 10% (65% and above and below 75%) in each semester with genuine reasons shall be approved by a committee duly appointed by the college. A fee stipulated by the college shall be payable towards condonation of shortage of attendance.

Shortage of Attendance below 65% in aggregate shall in NO case be condoned.

A Student will not be promoted to the next semester unless he satisfies the attendance requirement of the present semester. He/she may seek re-admission for that semester when offered next.

The overall attendance in each semester of regular B.Tech course and Honors course shall be computed separately.

A student shall maintain 75% attendance in courses of Honors/Minor to appear for semester end examination of Honors/Minor courses.

A student detained due to lack of attendance in Honors/Minor course shall not be permitted to continue Honors/Minor programme, but he/she can continue regular B.Tech programme.

7. Minimum Academic Requirements:

Conditions for pass and award of credits for a course:

A candidate shall be declared to have passed the individual course if he/she secures not less than 35% of marks in the end examination (in fraction rounded to lower digit) and a minimum of 40% of marks in the sum total of the mid semester and end examination marks taken together for the theory, practical, design, drawing subject or project etc. In case of a mandatory course, he/she should secure 40% of the total marks.

On passing a course of a programme, the student shall earn assigned credits in that Course.

Method of Awarding Letter Grades and Grade Points for a Course:

A letter grade and grade points will be awarded to a student in all courses having credits, based on his/her performance as per the grading system given below.

Calculation of Semester Grade Points Average (SGPA) for semester:

The performance of each student at the end of the each semester is indicated in terms of SGPA.

The SGPA is calculated as below:

Where CR = Credits of a Course
GP = Grade points awarded for a course

Calculation of Cumulative Grade Points Average (CGPA) and Award of Division for entire programme:

The CGPA is calculated as below:

Where CR = Credits of a course

GP = Grade points awarded for a course

Both SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

8. Supplementary Examinations:

Supplementary examinations will be conducted along with regular examinations and after the declaration of results of regular examinations of that semester.

9. With-holding of Results:

If the candidate has any dues not paid to the university or if any case of indiscipline or malpractice is pending against him/her, the result of the candidate shall be withheld in such cases.

10. Conditions for Promotion:

A student will be promoted from one semester to another semester if he/she satisfies the minimum attendance requirement.

A student shall be promoted from II to III year only if he fulfills the academic requirement of total **40**% credits (if the number of credits is in fraction, it will be rounded off to a lower digit) from regular and supplementary examinations of I year and II year examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the examination or not.

A student shall be promoted from III year to IV year only if he fulfills the academic requirements of total **40%** credits (if number of credits is in fraction, it will be rounded off to lower digit) from regular and supplementary examinations of I Year, II Year and

III Year examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the examinations or not.

11. Transitory Regulations:

Discontinued, detained, or failed candidates are eligible for readmission as and when the semester is offered next after fulfillment of academic regulations. Candidates who have been detained for want of attendance or not fulfilled academic requirements or who have failed after having undergone the course in earlier regulations or have discontinued and wish to continue the course are eligible for admission into the unfinished semester from the date of commencement of class work with the same or equivalent subjects as and when subjects are offered, subject to Section 1 and they will follow the academic regulations into which they are readmitted.

12. Minimum Instruction Days:

The minimum instruction days for each semester shall be 90.

13. There shall be no branch transfer after the completion of admission process.

14. General:

Wherever the words "he," "him," "his," occur in the regulations, they include "she," "her," "hers" as well.

The academic regulation should be read as a whole for the purpose of any interpretation.

In the case of any doubt or ambiguity in the interpretation of the above rules, the decision of the Principal is final.

The college may change or amend the academic regulations or syllabi at any time and the changes or amendments made shall be applicable to all the students with effect from the dates notified by the college.

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Academic Regulations 2025 (AR25) for B. Tech (Lateral Entry-Full time Scheme)

(Effective for the students admitted into II year from the Academic Year 2025-26 onwards)

1. Award of B. Tech. Degree:

A student will be declared eligible for the award of the B. Tech. Degree if he/she fulfills the following academic regulations.

Registered for 120 credits and he/she must secure total 120 credits.

Students, who fail to complete their three-year course of study within 6 years or fail to acquire 120 Credits for the award of the degree within 6 academic years from the year of their admission shall forfeit their seat in B. Tech course and their admission shall stand cancelled.

2. Promotion Rule:

A lateral entry student will be promoted from II year to III year if he satisfies the minimum required attendance in II year.

A student shall be promoted from III year to IV year only if he fulfills the academic requirements of total **40%** of credits (if the number of credits is in fraction, it will be rounded off to lower digit) from the II Year and III Year examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the examinations or not.

3. All other regulations as applicable for B. Tech. four- year degree course (Regular-Full time) will hold good for B. Tech. (Lateral Entry Scheme)
